- Potential for excellence in teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in Sport Management.
- Potential for success in the advising and mentoring of graduate students.

- Expertise and commitment needed to make substantial contributions toward the research productivity of the Sport Management program.
- Experience conducting interdisciplinary and collaborative research with colleagues in other related fields of Kinesiology and within the broader scientific community.
- Experience teaching undergraduate and/or graduate courses in Sport Management.
